Hi Sierra Families! The first two quarters of the year are coming to a close. It has been a wonderful first half of the year.

Over the past month there have been a number of items that have occurred to help with over all school safety at Sierra. The Stanton Way and Harrisburg Place gates are closed to traffic from approximately 8:30 to 1:50 daily. Cars and people will no longer have access to our campus during the middle of the day. We have also taken some steps to insure our front and back gates are locked down in a more efficient manner. Sierra now has eight working cameras located around campus for us to use to help monitor activities happening throughout the school day or after school. These updates are in place for us to help improve student safety.

Starting in January, after school library use will be used for Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math (STEM) activities. Each week we will have different STEM projects and activities for the students to explore and investigate. Students must sign up in advance for these STEM classes. The library will not be open for general use, unless students are involved with the STEM activities. We believe this will allow students to have a great opportunity to learn about STEM. The Summit homework help and math infusion rooms will still open for students to complete assignments and get additional help.
