Hi Spartan Families! I am very excited to be writing our first newsletter of the year. We are off to a Great start. I use the word "Great" very strategically. Our staff does not want to be a good school, our expectation is to be a Great school. This means we want to excel in academics, student/staff relationships, to have engaging lessons and opportunities for students each day, and to have a safe school environment.

Academically, Sierra has two major focuses this year. As a site we are committed improving student-writing skills. As a staff, we will spend our meetings and professional development time learning new strategies, reading selected articles, writing responses, and analyzing the data through writing rubrics. We will also place an emphasis on using engaging and strategic strategies in teaching math concepts to students.

Dear Sierra Families:

In Houston, Texas, thousands of citizens await rescue as conditions worsen and the death toll increases in the wake of Hurricane Harvey. An estimated 30,000 to 40,000 homes have been completely destroyed, leaving men, women and children without shelter, food, and other bare necessities for survival.

Here at Sierra, we strongly believe in lending a helping hand to the Stockton community and beyond. With your help, we would like to provide much needed relief for the good people of Houston who have been adversely affected by the hurricane. We are asking staff and Sierra families to consider donating much needed supplies for this community.

Our plan is to use the items that have been donated and create care packages to be sent to Houston. We have already reached out to Wheeler Avenue Baptist Church who is serving the Greater Houston community as an intake and distribution center. 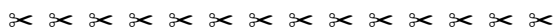
- Towels, Baby Formula, Shampoo/Conditioner

### Sierra Dance Party Guidelines

Students, please take note of the following dance "rules." You are responsible for following them. Please take this flyer home and share it with your parents as well.

- ◆ It is easiest for students to buy their ticket in advance. Tickets will be on sale for about a week. They are on sale from Room 11 during lunch. We will also sell them at the door of the dance, but the people who buy theirs ahead of time will get to come in first. The cost is \$6. This includes a snack and drink.
- ◆ Since Sierra is a uniform school, all students must come in uniform to the dance.\* **Students will not be allowed to enter the dance if they are out of uniform**, or if their clothes are out of compliance with the uniform/dress code policy. (\*The only exception to this is **if** there is a dress up day/free dress day on the day of the dance.) **They may also NOT chew gum in the dance for safety reasons, nor use their cell phones as this is against school policy.**
- ◆ Backpacks are not allowed in the dances. They will be stored in classrooms 7, 8, 9, and 12. Adults will supervise their check-in and check-out, and students will be given a backpack ticket so that we are sure to get the correct backpack returned to its owner. **Students should look outside the rooms for a poster. They should go to the room that has the first initial of their last name posted.**
- ◆ Students may only leave the dance early if they have an appointment. A **parent with ID may check out their child with the principal/principal's designee.** Early dance dismissals should be a rare occasion as it is difficult to find kids in a busy dance setting.
- ◆ **The dance concludes at 5:00 P.M. and students will then be released. Please wait patiently outside (in the main parking lot) for your child.**
- ◆ **There are no refunds on dance tickets**, if a student leaves school and shows up after 3:15, we cannot let him/her in and **we cannot issue a refund.** Please keep this in mind.
- ◆ Students are expected to show courtesy and respect for all parent/staff chaperones and the dj in the dance. They are here to ensure our safety. Please be sure to be polite ... we are able to have dances because of these wonderful volunteers.
- ◆ We encourage students to have fun and show off their moves, but remind them **that freak dancing, and other inappropriate gestures are not acceptable at a middle school dance.** We encourage them to show their creativity, but if it would embarrass Grandma, it probably isn't appropriate for school. ☺ If dancing is inappropriate, chaperones will ask the student to stop and parents may be called. **Students may also not be allowed to attend future dances.** Dance attendance is a privilege that can be revoked by school administration.
- ◆ We play a variety of music to meet the needs of all students. At any given dance you may hear rap, R&B, Pop, Country, Alternative, etc. We try to play stuff for everyone. All music will be radio edited, and school appropriate.
- ◆ **Please remember that students MUST confirm their own eligibility before buying a dance ticket. Students must have a 2.0 grade point average with no Fs in order to attend and meet all LUSD and SMS behavioral and grade eligibility requirements. Students will also not be allowed to attend if they have earned a referral or are suspended on dance day.** If you have questions, see Mrs. Heck or Mr. Tatum. **REFUNDS WILL NOT BE GIVEN if students purchase a ticket ahead of time and are ineligible to attend. Tickets can be bought at the door if they are unsure of their status.** Mr. Tatum will confirm eligibility at the door. If a student is ineligible, he/she will not be allowed to attend. (FOR THE FIRST DANCE, WE WILL NOT BE IMPOSING THE GRADE REQUIREMENT ... THIS WILL TAKE EFFECT FOR THE SECOND DANCE IN OCT.)
- ◆ Phones do not belong at the dance ... since we are still on campus, students need to leave their phones in a safe place and **do not take them out to talk or text during the dance.**
